What is Local Area Co-ordination?

Supported by Fife Forum, Local Area Co-ordination works alongside individuals aged 16+, their families, carers and other services to identify community groups and supports which help people to maintain their independence for as long as is practicable and/or connect with and be part of their community (for example: we provide information on and can help people to access day services; local clubs; or, interest groups).

Our primary aim is to help people feel valued and to reduce social isolation and loneliness.


Local Area Co-ordination & Covid-19

Advocacy for older people in care homes and community hospitals

"Why we have advocacy support in Fife and what is it?

Advocacy support is a statutory right for everyone in Scotland, and every local authority is required to fund this service. For some, when advocacy is suggested, this may be the first time they have heard of an advocacy service. For others, it has proven to be a useful service. Here's why:

As an advocate, I am able to support an individual in making their feelings known during stressful times, such as through a hospital discharge process, while staying in the hospital, or when receiving a welfare or financial guardianship order. It could even be that the person concerned has different points of view about their situation from their family and loved ones.

Adding an advocacy voice to someone's life enables them with the opportunity to raise their voice and helps get their voice heard. Generally, these times can be very stressful periods. Guardianships, hospital stays, and temporary stays in care homes are ultimately designed and enforced to keep people safe. So, during temporary stressful changes in circumstances, staff are often very busy keeping everyone safe. In these situations, there is often limited time to spend with someone, to listen to their current problems, and to assist them in making their feelings known.

Advocacy is here to help. Advocates help ensure that the processes enacting the legislation are delivered with kindness and compassion, demonstrating an understanding of how someone may feel when placed in these particular circumstances.

It's a simple process: providing a listening ear together with straightforward answers and information about these difficult incidents in life, helping people understand their particular situation.

In practice:

I can help individuals communicate their feelings to specific professionals, such as social workers, occupational therapists, doctors, or within a complaints process.
